But how does she find the love of her life? And how does a prince of a man find his love? In the fairy tale, it's a waiting game for both of them. If you are playing the waiting game right now, be patient. Wait for God's choice of a date who—by God's design—might become your mate.

*“For you, O LORD, do I wait; it is you,
O Lord my God, who will answer.”
(Psalm 38:15)*

Q: “If we truly love each other, why should it make a difference if I date and marry someone not of my same faith?”

Since emotions come and go, passionate love may be here today and gone tomorrow. The divorce courts are full of statistics to verify the impermanence of romantic love. However, unity in marriage is built on common grounds such as . . .

- The same religious traditions
- The same moral values
- The same system of ethics
- The same spiritual foundation

A new house has the best opportunity to endure if it is built on one solid foundation. When you are “equally yoked” with someone of the same faith, you will have a greater sense of unity, cohesiveness, and oneness on which you can build your lives together.

- **Don't** focus on romance but rather on friendship. (Proverbs 17:17)

- **Don't** lie if you don't want to accept a date. (Proverbs 12:19)

Do . . . Be under the authority of your parents (if living at home). (Proverbs 19:20)

- **Don't** confuse lust for love. (1 Corinthians 13:4-7)

Do . . . Reflect Christian values when you date. (Philippians 1:27)

- **Don't** date non-Christians. (1 Corinthians 2:14)

Do . . . Trust God's plan for your life. (Jeremiah 29:11)

- **Don't** wait to determine your standards. (Hebrews 13:1)

Do . . . Become a good and honorable date. (1 Corinthians 10:23-24)

Guidelines for Finding the Right Date and Mate

- **Establish** your convictions for dating; write them down and post them in a highly visible place.
- **Share** your convictions with others who will hold you accountable to abide by them.
- **Establish** friendships, rather than sexual relationships.
- **Select** good friends who share your moral convictions.
- **Stay** away from activities that will compromise your convictions.
- **Be** selective with movies, music, videos, television, and the Internet.
- **Refuse** to go to the bedroom, house, or apartment of your date without having others present.
- **Avoid** dates who gossip about others . . . soon they'll gossip about you.
- **Practice** saying no to others so that you can say yes to God.

Prioritizing Purity in Dating

Prioritize God's standard for purity in your dating. (Hebrews 13:4)

Undertake personal accountability for how you treat your date's body. (1 Thessalonians 4:6)

Repent of any activity that violates God's standard by arousing sexual desires, and recommit to sexual purity. (1 Thessalonians 4:3–4)

Implement goals that are pleasing to God. (2 Corinthians 5:9–10)

Trust in God's timing. (Genesis 29:20)

Yield to God your right to date and marry. (Matthew 6:33)
